

**THE LEGACY PROJECT** is a time of discernment for congregations to identify gifts of the congregation, reflect upon their impact to the community, and plan for the future. The FPC Legacy Project team is working on this with representatives from Foothills Presbytery and the Presbyterian Foundation.

The team has met several times for discussions of "Sailboat Church." We would like to share some of the key points from each chapter with the Congregation. Each week, through October 3rd, the bulletin will

highlight important messages from a chapter in the book. This week Chapter **four** will be our focus.

# Chapter 4 "Our Boat, the Church"

The church is a divine, even supernatural, community gathered by God to do God's work. The holiness of the body of Christ does not come from its individual members. It comes from Christ, who keeps us in grace and gives forgiveness, transformation, and new life.

In the Fullness of Time, Jesus: In his suffering-servant death on the cross, Jesus gave birth to the church. He is the captain of our Sailboat. His cross is its mast. He calls believers to live as sailors, setting sail by the Spirit and navigating in the flow of God's will. But even if the sails are raised and the sailors are ready, a Sailboat has to have wind in order to sail. This is why what happened on Pentecost is so crucial to the church's story.

From Pentecost day onward, the Holy Spirit worked within the first believers to help them understand the true meaning of Jesus' life, teachings, death, and resurrection. The church was created to be a Spirit-powered mission movement, and in this regard nothing has changed since the day of Pentecost.

**FORTY DAYS OF PRAYER:** The next step in the Legacy Project is "Forty Days of Prayer." The congregation is urged to do these daily prayers with the team. Prayers begin today. You should have received the first two weeks of prayers in an Eblast or by mail. Printed copies are available in the Narthex.
